Dear Mr. Chairman,

Thank you for your letter of January 8 requesting the names of the 53 political prisoners the United States discussed with the Cuban government. As you know, we shared the names of individuals jailed in Cuba on charges related to their political activities. Raul Castro announced December 17 that the Cuban government had decided to release those individuals. The Government of Cuba began releasing a small number of those individuals in the weeks and months prior to the December 17 announcement. In the last few days, the remainder of the 53 dissidents were released. Attached you will find a list of these individuals.

As President Obama said on December 17, we are "under no illusions about the continued barriers to freedom that remain for ordinary Cubans." In fact, that's one of the key reasons we've shifted our policy – because we know the status quo had not succeeded in helping these Cubans meet their aspirations. We will continue to make clear to the Cuban government that neither those 53 individuals released, nor any Cuban exercising their universal right to have their voices heard, be subject to harassment, arrest or beatings.

Obviously we are deeply concerned by reports of short-term detentions of Cubans peacefully attempting to express their opinions in the wake of the President's announcement. As the President said, we do not expect that the changes to U.S. policy will effect a transformation of Cuban society overnight. We are convinced, however, the old policy of isolation did not achieve its objectives, and that a new policy will more effectively promote our values and help the Cuban people help themselves as they move into the 21st century.
