Dear Deputy Secretary McKeon:

The House Committee on Foreign Affairs is investigating the Biden Administration's August 2021 withdrawal from Afghanistan. Given your service as Deputy Secretary of State for Management and Resources, and your significant involvement in matters related to Afghanistan, you are a critical witness for this investigation. The Committee requests that you appear for a transcribed interview.

Please arrange by no later than 5:00 p.m. EDT on September 7, 2023 for this transcribed interview to be scheduled.

Congress' oversight powers are derived from the U.S. Constitution and have been repeatedly affirmed by the United States Supreme Court.¹ Under House Rule X, the Committee has legislative and oversight jurisdiction over “[r]elations of the United States with foreign nations generally,” “[d]iplomatic service,” and “[p]rotection of American citizens abroad and expatriation.”²
