A BILL

To amend the Export Control Reform Act of 2018 to prevent foreign adversaries from exploiting United States artificial intelligence and other enabling technologies, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE AND TABLE OF CONTENTS.
- 4 (a) Short Title.—This Act may be cited as the
- 5 "Enhancing National Frameworks for Overseas Restric-
- 6 tion of Critical Exports Act" or "ENFORCE Act".

3	SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.
4	Section 1742 of the Export Control Reform Act of
5	2018 (50 U.S.C. 4801) is amended by adding at the end
6	the following:
7	"(15) Additional definitions.—
8	"(A) ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE.—The
9	term 'artificial intelligence' has the meaning
10	given that term in section 5002(3) of the Na-
11	tional Artificial Intelligence Initiative Act of
12	2020 (15 U.S.C. 9401(3)).
13	"(B) ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE SYS-
14	TEM.—The term 'artificial intelligence system'
15	means any software or hardware implementa-
16	tion of artificial intelligence, including artificial
17	intelligence model weights and any numerical
18	parameters associated with the artificial intel-
19	ligence implementation.
20	"(C) COVERED ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE
21	SYSTEM.—
22	"(i) Interim definition.—For the
23	period beginning on the date of the enact-

1	ment of this paragraph and ending on the
2	date on which the Secretary issues the reg-
3	ulations required by clause (ii), the term
4	'covered artificial intelligence system'
5	means an artificial intelligence system
6	that—
7	"(I) exhibits, or could foreseeably
8	be modified to exhibit, capabilities in
9	the form of high levels of performance
10	at tasks that pose a serious risk to
11	the national security and foreign pol-
12	icy of the United States or any com-
13	bination of those matters, even if it is
14	provided to end users with technical
15	safeguards that attempt to prevent
16	users from taking advantage of the
17	relevant capabilities, such as by—
18	"(aa) substantially lowering
19	the barrier of entry for experts or
20	non-experts to design, synthesize,
21	acquire, or use chemical, biologi-
22	cal, radiological, or nuclear
23	(CBRN) weapons or weapons of
24	mass destruction;

1	"(bb) enabling offensive
2	cyber operations through auto-
3	mated vulnerability discovery and
4	exploitation against a wide range
5	of potential targets of cyber at-
6	tacks; or
7	"(ce) permitting the evasion
8	of human control or oversight
9	through means of deception or
10	obfuscation; or
11	"(II) can reasonably be expected
12	to exhibit the capabilities described in
13	subclause (I), such as by dem-
14	onstrating technical similarity or
15	equivalent performance to models in
16	which relevant capabilities have
17	emerged unexpectedly.
18	"(ii) Final definition.—
19	"(I) IN GENERAL.—Not later
20	than 365 days after the date of the
21	enactment of this paragraph, the Sec-
22	retary, in consultation with the Sec-
23	retary of State, the Secretary of De-
24	fense, and the Secretary of Energy,
25	shall issue regulations defining the

1	term 'covered artificial intelligence
2	system' for purposes of this subtitle.
3	Thereafter, the Secretary, in consulta-
4	tion with the Secretary of State, the
5	Secretary of Defense, and the Sec-
6	retary of Energy, shall update the
7	definition of such term as necessary.
8	"(II) Factors.—In developing
9	the definition of the term 'covered ar-
10	tificial intelligence system' under this
11	clause, the Secretary, in consultation
12	with the Secretary of State, the Sec-
13	retary of Defense, and the Secretary
14	of Energy, shall consider technical
15	and non-technical factors, including
16	those factors that will most effectively
17	promote the national security of the
18	United States.
19	"(D) Model weight.—The term 'model
20	weight' means a numerical parameter within an
21	artificial intelligence model that helps determine
22	the model's outputs in response to inputs.".

1 SEC. 3. AUTHORITY OF THE PRESIDENT.

2	Section 1753(a) of the Export Control Reform Act
3	of 2018 (50 U.S.C. 4812(a)) is amended by adding at the
4	end the following:
5	"In addition, in order to carry out the policy set forth in
6	paragraphs (1) through (10) of section 1752, the Presi-
7	dent may control the activities of United States persons,
8	wherever located, relating to specific covered artificial in-
9	telligence systems and emerging and foundational tech-
10	nologies that are identified as essential to the national se-
11	curity of the United States pursuant to section 1758(a).".
12	SEC. 4. ADDITIONAL AUTHORITIES.
13	Section 1754(d) of the Export Control Reform Act
14	of 2018 (50 U.S.C. 4813(d)) is amended by adding at the
15	end the following:
16	"(3) Additional authorities.—In further-
17	ance of section 1753(a), the President may require
18	a United States person, wherever located, to apply
19	for and receive a license from the Department of
20	Commerce for—
21	"(A) the export, reexport, or in-country
22	transfer of items described in paragraph (4), in-
23	cluding items that are not subject to control
24	under this subchapter; and
25	"(B) other activities that may support the
26	design, development, production, use, operation,

1	installation, maintenance, repair, overhaul, or
2	refurbishing of, or for the performance of serv-
3	ices relating to, any items described in para-
4	graph (4).
5	"(4) Items described.—The items described
6	in this paragraph include—
7	"(A) covered artificial intelligence systems;
8	and
9	"(B) specific emerging and foundational
10	technologies that are identified as essential to
11	the national security of the United States pur-
12	suant to section 1758(a).".
13	SEC. 5. AMENDMENT TO INTERNATIONAL EMERGENCY
14	ECONOMIC POWERS ACT.
15	Section 203(b)(3) of the International Emergency
16	Economic Powers Act (50 U.S.C. 1702(b)(3)) is amended
17	by striking "section 5 of the Export Administration Act
18	of 1979, or under section 6 of such Act to the extent that
19	such controls promote the nonproliferation or
20	antiterrorism policies of the United States" and inserting
21	"section 1754 of the Export Control Reform Act of 2018".
