# Counter-Iran and Proxy Legislation in the 118th Congress

Iran-backed Hamas' brutal October 7 attack on Israel killed over 1,200 innocent people, including Americans, and Iran and its proxies are actively attacking U.S. servicemembers and international shipping. The House Foreign Affairs Committee is working tirelessly in a bipartisan manner to provide solutions to this growing threat and weaken Iran and its proxies by cutting off their resources. The Senate must act quickly to send House-passed bills to the President's desk.

# **PASSED THE HOUSE:**

### H.R. 3152, Fight and Combat Rampant Iranian Missile Exports Act (Chairman McCaul)

A Imposes mandatory property blocking and visa sanctions on anyone involved in the supply, sale, transfer of, or support for Iran's drone and missile program.

#### H.R. 589, MAHSA Act (Rep. Banks)

A Requires full enforcement of human rights sanctions on the Iranian regime.

# H.R. 340, Hamas International Financing Prevention Act (Rep. Mast)

A Sanctions Hamas, Palestinian Islamic Jihad, Al-Agsa Martyr's Brigade, the Lion's Den, and other Palestinian terrorist groups and their supporters.

# H.R. 5961, No Funds for Iranian Terrorism Act (Chairman McCaul)

A Prevents Iran from accessing the \$6 billion in Iranian funds being held in Qatar by imposing sanctions on any bank that transacts with this money, and prohibits the President from using Iran-related sanctions waiver authorities. An amendment by Rep. Pfluger to this bill expands and permanently freezes \$10 billion in sanctioned Iranian assets in Iraq without exception.



# H.R. 3774, SHIP Act (Rep. Lawler)

A Requires sanctions on ports and refineries that receive and process Iranian oil

### H.R. 3033, Solidify Iran Sanctions Act (Rep. Steel)

A Repeals the sunset provision in the 1996 Iran Sanctions Act, which serves as the foundation for U.S. sanctions on Iran.

#### H.R. 4691, Iran Sanctions Relief Review Act of 2023 (Rep. Self)

A Gives Congress the opportunity to review and disapprove of any Iran sanctions relief proposal from the President, including for a nuclear deal.

#### H.R. 5826, No Paydays to Hostage-Takers Act (Rep. Wilson)

beters the Government of Iran, and others, from taking U.S. hostages by imposing sanctions and strict penalties.

#### H.R. 5917, Strengthening Tools to Counter the Use of Human Shields Act (Rep. Gallagher)

A Strengthens the 2018 Sanctioning the Use of Civilians as Defenseless Shields Act by adding Palestinian Islamic Jihad as a covered entity, providing new authorities to hold accountable those who use human shields, and reauthorizing the law through 2030.

# H.R. 6603, No Technology for Terror Act (Rep. Moran, Chairman McCaul)

**A** Further restricts the export or re-export of U.S.-origin goods and technology to Iran, including those used to manufacture missiles and drones attacking our forces across the Middle East.

#### H.R. 6046, the Standing Against Houthi Aggression Act (Rep. Clyde)

A Re-lists the Houthis as a Foreign Terrorist Organization, the strongest possible designation, after the Biden administration de-listed the group in 2021.
